


COMMUNITY OUTREACH-PARENT SEMINAR

Have you ever wondered what to say to your children about sexual abuse? Do you feel unsure about how much to share with young children about sex? A new Community Outreach program at the Children's . Center can help to answer these questions and more! The Parent Seminar is a workshop for parents about talking with young children about sexual abuse and safety. Talking with kids about topics like body parts, safe and unsafe touches, and secrets can help to protect children and encourage them to report.

Over 90% of child sexual abuse is committed by adults who are well-known and trusted by the child and family, and it is very common for children to keep the abuse a secret. There are many reasons why children don't tell about abuse, and the goal of this Seminar is to help parents help their kids overcome secret-keeping.

WILL MY CHILD BE INTERROGATED DURING THE INTERVIEW?

No! Although parents cannot accompany children to the interview room, the interview rooms have a child friendly atmosphere. Children talk to an interviewer while law enforcement and children's division watch on a screen in the observation room. Our interviewers are trained to ask children non-leading questions and are always sure to tell the child that they are safe and not in any trouble. We also do not interview alleged perpetrators.
